The Sermon by Rev Howard Wright Revelation 21:9-27and John 17:20-26 – The Wedding

Today, in advent and at the conclusion of our teaching series, we jump ahead in Revelation, for a sneak peek – and will return to the book in the New Year.

We read about, one of the seven angels, seven bowls, seven plagues. We've skipped a lot of sevens. There have been seven scenes, and now there's eighth!

Like the Old Testament Jubilee year, after 7 x 7s (that is 49) is the Jubilee year, an eighth and the year of the Lord's favour. But even more, the eighth scene at the end of earth's time is like the like the resurrection day – it is the first day of the new week.

This is the new permanent. The bride has proved faithful and has been victorious. Read again Revelation 21:9-11.

The seven letters were a full diagnosis of the church's condition – taking the 7 together represents the whole church, the whole people of God, His bride. Now at the end of the that era and the with the dawning of the rest of eternity, the bride has been fully prepared.

This city representing the bride is precious. God dwells within us, in the midst of us and causes us to shine with his radiance, and we are made precious. The stones mentioned, all have echoes in the Old Testament and indicate our value. We are become the way that we were meant to be.

The city representing the bride is founded (foundations) on truth (see v.14), that is the foundation of the apostles teaching. And, this city is vast – the 12,000 stadia, approximately 1,380 miles is symbolic of spacious. We might like the church in Philadelphia feel little but we are mighty.

All the promises and encouragements have come true:

- To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God. (Ephesus Revelation 2:7)
- The one who is victorious will not be hurt at all by the second death. (Smyrna Revelation 2:11)

- To the one who is victorious, I will give some of the hidden manna. I will also give that person a white stone with a new name written on it, known only to the one who receives it. (Pergamum Revelation 2:17)
- ²⁶ To the one who is victorious and does my will to the end, I will give authority over the nations ²⁷ that one "will rule them with an iron sceptre and will dash them to pieces like pottery" just as I have received authority from my Father. ²⁸ I will also give that one the morning star. (Thyatira Revelation 2:26-28)
- The one who is victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out the name of that person from the book of life, but will acknowledge that name before my Father and his angels. (Sardis Revelation 3:5)
- The one who is victorious I will make a pillar in the temple of my God. Never again will they leave it. I will write on them the name of my God and the name of the city of my God, the new Jerusalem, which is coming down out of heaven from my God; and I will also write on them my new name. (Philadelphia – Revelation 3:12)
- To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with my Father on his throne. (Laodicea – Revelation 3:21)

This the hope and future for the faithful, it's our future because of Jesus. We are invited into inherit all this. Our future is secure and truly marvellous.

Yesterday at Roger Fletcher's Thanksgiving service we read: 1 Thessalonians 4:13 & 18 – please read this.

C.S. Lewis talks about this life as insubstantial, without solidity or colour, whereas the future that awaits us is solid and abundant in colour, overwhelming in light and joy, love, a place where we are whole – it is the home we are made for – the actual and genuine 'happily ever after.'

And glimpsing this future can inspire us today. If you've been to the cinema and it's a good movie, you can be so drawn in the story and setting, that when the movie finishes and you make your way home, you feel that you might even see a character appear around the next corner.

Our glimpsing of the glory that awaits us enables us to see God at work today — even as though this future will appear around the next corner. Be inspired today — to live for Christ, to remain faithful against ideas or behaviours that would lead us away, and to be determined to help others find Christ and this future for themselves. Live today in anticipation of the completeness that God has called us — God's Kingdom is coming, and will come, his will, will be done. 'And so we will be with the Lord for ever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.' 1 Thessalonians 4:18

2nd Sunday of Advent: O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever. Amen.
